



LPA Summary of the Victorian **Budget 2017–18**

Dear Member

As Members may be aware, the Victorian Budget was handed down today (2 May 2017).

The 2017–18 Victorian State Budget has provided \$106.6 million in new funding for the creative industries. This includes funds for the following initiatives that the live performance industry should benefit from:

- \$40m over four years to support major maintenance works and behind-the-scenes upgrades at Arts Centre Melbourne.
- \$10m over five years (including \$1.7m previously allocated in the 2016-17 Budget) to support the new permanent Australian Music Hall of Fame exhibition space, Australian Music Vault, to be established at Arts Centre Melbourne.
- \$0.3m to support a major international music convention, Music City Convention, to be held in Melbourne in April 2018.
- \$6.7m over two years for operational maintenance funding of Victoria's state-owned arts and cultural institutions.

Additionally, the current \$575,000 payroll tax-free threshold will be increased to \$650,000 from 1 July 2018.

Businesses in regional Victoria will receive a 25 per cent discount on their payroll tax. The payroll tax rate will decrease to 3.65 per cent for businesses with payrolls that consist of at least 85 per cent regional employees.
