







LPA Summary: Western Australian Budget 2017–18

8 September 2017

Dear Member.

As Members may be aware, the Western Australia (WA) Budget was handed down yesterday.

There were no new funding initiatives dedicated to the live performance industry, however the WA Budget contains funding for a range of arts and culture initiatives:

- \$10 million to the Art Gallery of Western Australia towards the Art Gallery's rooftop activation project and for new acquisitions through the TomorrowFund.
- \$133.3 million is budgeted to be spent on asset investment in 2017-18, including \$121.4 million for the continued delivery of the New Museum Project and \$10.2 million for library materials for public libraries and the State reference library.
- **\$8 million** boost to give people living outside the metropolitan region increased **access to arts and culture** and widen the exposure of collections travelling throughout the State.
- \$750,000 fund which will provide grants to regional museums to apply to improve, promote or restore their collections.
- \$10 million investment in the Western Australian Film Fund.
- \$24.5 million for 4 schools to build and 1 school to upgrade performing arts centres.

The Budget Papers also note that "a decline in Lotterywest revenue will impact the funding available to recurrently-funded arts and cultural organisations." (pg 371, BP2)
