Announcing Sydney Coliseum Theatre, West HQ Opening December 2019

Sydney's next great theatre is opening in December 2019. Originally launched as the Western Sydney Performing Arts Centre, it has been recently rebranded as the **Sydney Coliseum Theatre, West HQ**.

The Sydney Coliseum Theatre, West HQ will be able to present fullscale Broadway musicals, symphony orchestras, ballet performances, live contemporary music, comedy and family entertainment. It will be the first venue in Greater Western Sydney capable of hosting productions previously only staged in the CBD.





The theatre will offer state of the art facilities for producers and audiences including:

- Multi-mode theatre capable of hosting musicals, dramatic theatre, live music and more
- Nine metre Proscenium Arch offering the latest in front and back of house technical capabilities
- Full immersive sound and acoustic design
- The latest theatre technology and sustainable LED lighting
- 80 line fly system
- Orchestra pit for 30
- Excellent sightlines
- Rehearsal room and production office with stage access
- Comfortable and spacious production amenities including 11 dressing rooms
- Adjacent 4.5 star Novotel hotel offering 164 rooms

The \$100 million theatre located at West HQ in Rooty Hill has been a 10-year project from inception to build and is on track for an opening gala in late 2019. The theatre is scheduled to open to the public in December 2019.
