LPA Summary: ACT Budget 2019-20

Dear Member,

As Members may be aware, the Australian Capital Territory (ACT) Budget 2019-20 was handed down on 4 June 2019.

The ACT Budget included the following new funding commitments to benefit the ACT's live performance sector:

- **\$995k over two years** to improve core building facilities at the Canberra Theatre Centre by investing in a building management system, plant and equipment
- **\$1.7m over three years** for upgrades and preparation of designs for further capital works at the Ainslie + Gorman Arts Centres and the Strathnairn Arts Centre.

Through the *Better Infrastructure Fund*, the ACT Budget included:

- **\$418k in 2019-20** for improving cultural and arts facilities, including **\$120k** for the Canberra Theatre Centre
- **\$546k in 2019-20** for arts facilities and buildings, including improving arts facilities and upgrades to arts buildings.
