







## **LPA Summary: NSW Budget 2019-20**

Dear Member,

As Members may be aware, the New South Wales (NSW) State Budget 2019-20 was handed down today (18 June).

The NSW Budget included the following new and ongoing investments in the live performance sector and arts more broadly:

- \$113.5m to rejuvenate the Walsh Bay Arts Precinct, providing a unique cultural and visitor experience.
- **\$76.6m** for the **Sydney Opera House** renewal program and security updates.
- \$61.3m for Arts and Cultural Development Program grants to support arts and cultural organisations, artists and workers.
- \$28.9m from the Regional Cultural Fund to support the development of arts and cultural activities in the State's regions.

The NSW Budget 2019-20 also included:

\$92.1m in 2019-20 to continue the Creative Kids program, which provides parents and guardians with a \$100 voucher per school-aged child, to help with the cost of their participation in creative and cultural activities.

The NSW Government will increase the payroll tax-free threshold to \$900,000 from 1 July 2019. The Government is continuing to implement payroll tax cuts, progressively raising the payroll tax threshold to \$1 million by 2021-22, providing tax relief for those small to medium sized businesses.
