

LPA Summary: QLD Budget 2019-20

Dear Member,

As Members may be aware, the Queensland (QLD) State Budget 2019-20 was handed down on 11 June.

The QLD Budget included the following funding commitments to benefit Queensland's live performance sector:

- **\$7m** over two years towards the renewal of the Central Energy Plant to maintain environmental conditions and meet increased service demand at the Queensland Cultural Centre
- \$5m over two years to modernise Queensland Performing Arts Centre's lighting via the installation of energy efficient LED lighting
- \$2m of additional funding over two years to develop an options assessment to establish an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Cultural Centre in Brisbane
- \$12.9m through contestable funding programs, including the Organisations Fund, Queensland Arts Showcase Program and Playing Queensland Fund
- \$6m through the Arts Infrastructure Fund to support the revitalisation of existing Stateowned arts and cultural facilities, including the Judith Wright Centre of Contemporary Arts and the Cairns Centre of Contemporary Arts.

The QLD Government also introduced changes to payroll tax, including:

- reducing tax payable for small businesses by increasing the exemption threshold to \$1.3 million
- introducing a 1% rate reduction for regional employers
- providing a temporary rebate of up to \$20,000 to businesses taking on new employees
- continuing the 50% payroll tax rebate on the wages of apprentices and trainees until 30 June 2021
- increasing the payroll tax rate for employers with taxable wages above \$6.5 million.
