



Coronavirus National Border Restrictions (As of 4:30pm 2 April 2020)



Notes applicable to Australia, nationally:

- 1. All states and territories have put in place enforced quarantine measures for travellers from overseas. All travellers must quarantine, and will be forced to quarantine for 14 days in accommodation provided by the Government.
- 2. All self-isolation requirements are in addition to Australian Government requirements for all returning international travellers and specified cruise passengers to enter self-isolation at their point of arrival into Australia. This has the effect that some non-essential travellers will have to quarantine upon their arrival into Australia, and then quarantine again upon arrival into their home state
- 3. You must prove your status as an essential traveller before you will be granted an exemption from self-quarantine.
- 4. There are also significant intrastate travel restrictions that have been put in place that will act to significantly limit movement across borders, this is particularly true for ACT, NSW and VIC where it may be difficult to leave the state.

Overview of Interstate Border Controls	All interstate and international visitors to Tasmania must complete a Tasmanian Arrivals Form. Strict requirements for all non-essential travellers arriving in Tasmania to self-isolate in government provided accommodation are now in place. Families with children and young people aged 17 and under who are Tasmanian residents are instead required to self-isolate in their primary residence. Unaccompanied minors are required to self-isolate in their primary residence in Tasmania.	If you arrived in the NT from interstate prior to 11:59pm on 1 April 2020, you must self-quarantine for 14 days. Arrivals in NT from interstate from 11:59pm 1 April 2020 will be escorted to hotels and monitored for 14 days of quarantine. If you arrive after 3 April 2020 you will need to pay quarantine costs You must be able to prove your status as an essential traveller before you will be granted an exemption from self-quarantine. NB: From 11:59pm 26 March 2020, remote communities in NT were closed to all non-essential travel also.	All arrivals from interstate will be ordered to self-isolate for 14 days, unless exempted. These have been dubbed the toughest COVID-19 travel restrictions in Australia NB: remote communities in WA are also subject to strict restrictions with exceptions for essential travel.	All people entering South Australia are required to isolate for 14 days from their arrival. Required to identify a suitable residence and commence self-quarantine for 14 days from date of arrival in SA.	Anyone who arrives in Queensland (via air, sea, rail or road) from another State or Territory from 12.01 am on Friday 3 April 2020, who is not a Queensland resident or considered an 'exempt person', will not be allowed to enter Queensland. An 'exempt person' must also have obtained a Queensland Entry Pass prior to crossing the border. If you are a Queensland resident returning from any other place in Australia that is not a declared 'COVID19 hotspot' you do not have to enter self-quarantine. If a person is a resident or an exempt person, they must self-quarantine if they have travelled in the last 14 days overseas, or to particular areas of Australia.	No interstate travel related border controls. However, interstate travel is not advised at this time Note that ACT 'intrastate(territory?)' movement controls may affect movement into and out of NSW. Per Note 4 above.	No interstate travel related border controls. Note that VIC 'intrastate' movement controls may affect movement into and out of VIC along the border. Per Note 4 above. The Essential Traveller Categories are: 1. National and State Security Governance 2. Health Services 3. Transport, freight and logistics 4.
