## **OUTDOOR**

Seated outdoor entertainment venues can open with up to 75% of fixed seated capacity up to a maximum patron cap of 1000 people if events are ticketed. A density quotient of one person per 2 square metres applies in foyers, bars, bathrooms, etc. when using electronic record keeping. In venues not using electronic record keeping, a density quotient of one person per 4 square metres applies.

Non-seated outdoor entertainment venues can open with a density quotient of one person per 2 square metres when using electronic record keeping (otherwise 1 person per 4 square metres applies). Group limits have been removed. Indoor spaces at outdoor venues can open subject to the restrictions relevant to the space (e.g. hospitality or retail).

- the total number of persons present for the purposes of the defined public activity at the place (as a whole) must not exceed 1 person per 2 square metres; and
- the total number of persons present in any single room or enclosed area within the place (including where the place only consists of a single room or enclosed area) must not exceed 1 person per 2 square metres.

These requirements apply only to patrons (including infants and children), not staff.

The maximum number of attendees at a place of business is determined by its size.

Steps must be taken to maintain 1.5m physical distancing.

and theatres must continue to apply the Step 3.2 provisions of 50% capacity.

Exemptions may be granted for events and gatherings for up to 8,000 people on application through the COVID Safe Event Protocol. Any gatherings over 500 require an exemption.

Patrons must be seated when consuming alcohol in indoor spaces but can stand while eating.
