**PUBLIC EVENTS**

Public Events may occur in accordance with the Public Events Framework (PEF).

Organisers may apply for a Public Event to be considered under the PEF.

**o Tier 1:** highly complex and involving more than 5,000 attendees  
- submit a COVIDSafe Event Plan to the Victorian Government for public health approval

- submit a COVIDSafe Event Plan at least 8-10 weeks prior to the event

**o Tier 2:** moderately complex involving 1000-5,000 attendees  
- submit a COVIDSafe Event Plan to the Victorian Government for public health approval

- submit a COVIDSafe Event Plan at least 4-6 weeks prior to the event

**o Tier 3:** low complexity and involving 1000 attendees or less  
- submit a COVIDSafe Event Checklist to register the event at least 1 week prior to the event.
