Proof of vaccination will be required in order to gain entry. <p>Fully vaccinated international travellers do <u>not</u> need to quarantine. They must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Take a RAT within 24 hours of arriving in NSW and self-isolate until they receive a result Not visit high risk places for at least seven days after arrival.
