What are the entry requirements?

Unvaccinated Victorians, over 16 years old cannot travel to NSW for a holiday or recreation.

Entry to NSW is restricted when a Health concerns notice identifies affected areas, areas of concern and places of high concern.

Place of High Concern

If a traveller has been to a place of high concern, they may only enter NSW if a NSW resident.

If a traveller has been to a <u>place of high</u> <u>concern</u> (close contact) in the past 14 days, they must:

 not enter NSW until more than 14 days has passed (unvaccinated) or 7 days (fully vaccinated).
