COVID-19 Mandatory Workplace Vaccination for the Live Performance Industry



All the Orders below require employers to:

- collect, record and hold vaccination information of workers;
- not permit specific unvaccinated or partially vaccinated workers from attending the workplace; and
- notify current and new workers that the employer is obliged to collect, record and hold vaccination information about the worker

COVID-19 Mandatory Vaccination (Specified Worker) Order

All workers who perform the work listed below must be fully vaccinated have and exemption to attend the workplace. An exemption includes a medical contraindication to all approved COVID-19 vaccines or an acute medical illness (including COVID-19).

This may include:

- Creative Arts Workers in, an art studio, ceramics studio, music room or studio, rehearsal room or studio, and other facility that is used for creative art.
- Manufacturing Worker such as a costume maker
- Media and film production worker working in:
 - the production of feature films, theatre, television shows and documentaries (excluding television commercials, student and corporate productions)
- Broadcasting performances from an entertainment facility
- Rehearsals conducted in a theatre that has a seated capacity of more than 1000 people and ordinarily conducts performances on a commercial basis
- Rehearsals conducted by a National Performing Arts Partnership Company.
- Repair and maintenance workers performing maintenance cleaning and repairs or critical repairs to any premises where required for emergency and safety – for example technical maintenance and repair at a venue or theatre.
- Retail workers at any café, restaurant, licensed premises, fast-food

Pandemic Open Premises Order 2021 (No 1)

All workers who perform the work at the premises listed below must be fully vaccinated have and exemption to attend the workplace. An exemption includes a medical contraindication to all approved COVID-19 vaccines or an acute medical illness (including COVID-19).

This includes:

- Entertainment and function premises including
 - Theatres
 - Cinemas
 - Music hall or concert hall or auditorium
 - o Gallery or museum
 - State Library
 - Area or stadium
 - Karaoke
 - Nightclub
 - Function and convention centres
- Adult education or higher education premises such as TAFEs and universities
- Amusement parks
- Casino
- Community premises such as community halls and centres, youth centres,
- Creative arts premises (see above)
- Drive-in cinemas
- Food and drink premises
- Karaoke and nightclubs

For all Victorian Orders a medical exemption includes:

 a person who is unable, due to a medical contraindication, to receive any COVID-19 vaccine; or

<u>Building and Construction Industry Worker (Restrictions on Access)</u> <u>Directions No 2</u>

All Workers must have had two doses, and third dose in the required timeframe in order to perform at a building and construction site, including,

- Tradesmen and labourers,
- Architects and draftspeople,
- food vendors,
- set and stand builders and food vendors.

Primary Health Care Worker (Restrictions on Access) Directions

All Workers must have had two doses, and third dose in the required timeframe to perform work at primary health care facilities including premises where COVID-19 related testing or COVID-19 vaccination occurs

Booster Vaccination (Restrictions on Access) Directions (No.2)

From 5 February 2022 all workers required by the above directions to have two doses of a COVID-19 vaccine to attend work must also have a third dose (Booster); as follow:

 If a worker was eligible to receive a booster vaccination on 24 December 2021, the person must be administered the booster vaccination by 5 February 2022.





• If a worker becomes eligible to receive a booster vaccination after 24 December 2021, the person must be administered the booster vaccination within one calendar month of the date that they first became eligible to receive the booster vaccination, or by 5 February 2022, whichever is the latter.
