Welcome to our Government Wrap for the week ending 2 December 2022.

In this update, we focus on news and insights from the Commonwealth, state and territory governments of relevance and interest to the arts and entertainment industry.

This week

We connected with a number of MPs and their advisors, business and industry group leaders and senior officials this week at the ACCI business summit gala dinner which was held in the Great Hall at Parliament House and <u>addressed by</u> <u>the Prime Minister</u>. Federal Parliament has risen for the year and returns in early February 2023.

Coming up

We're keeping a close watch for the announcement of the Government's national cultural policy which has been slated for release before the end of this year.

Federal: Fair Work legislation passed

The Government has secured passage of its <u>Secure Jobs, Better Pay legislation</u> which it says will modernise the bargaining system, delivering better productivity and flexibility for employers and better pay and conditions for workers. LPA will continue to engage closely with the Minister's office and departmental officials on aspects related to the live performance industry.

Federal: Respect at Work

The Government passed its <u>Respect@Work legislation</u> to implement the recommendations of the Sex Discrimination Commissioner Kate Jenkins. The Australian Human Rights Commission released its <u>fifth national survey</u> on sexual harassment in Australian workplaces. A majority of Australians (77 per cent) have experienced sexual harassment at some point in their lives, including 89 per cent of women. Approximately one in five people have experienced sexual harassment at work in the last 12 months, with one in three reporting such an experience over the past five years.

Federal: National Arts and Disability Awards

Arts Access Australia and the Australia Council have announced the winners of the <u>National Arts and Disability Awards</u>, featuring three outstanding artists.
