## **Smoking laws in Australia**

Snapshot: Smoking and e-cigarettes in artistic performances Australia

- E-cigarettes may be used in smokefree areas if do not contain tobacco or any other herb/plant matter.
- Tobacco Products Control Regulations 2006 (Regulation 10) allows performers to smoke in enclosed public space if occupiers give consent before performance.

- Smoking and e-cigarettes (nicotine free) banned in smoke-free areas.
- Performers can smoke if, and only for as long as, it is a necessary part of the performance.



- Smoking and e-cigarettes (nicotine free) banned in smoke-free areas.
- Exemption for performers in Section 112 of the Tobacco and Other Smoking Products Act 1998.
- Allows performers to smoke in theatre or performance space if smoking is part of the performance.

- E-cigarettes (nicotine free) banned in areas where smoking is banned.
- Exemption for performers in Section 7(2) of the Smoke-Free Environment Act 2000.
- Allows performers to smoke in theatre or performance space if essential to the performance.
- Smoking tobacco products and e-cigarettes (whether containing nicotine or not) is banned in smoke-free areas.
- Smoking herbal cigarettes is permitted (non-e-cigarettes).

- E-cigarettes (nicotine free) banned in areas where smoking is banned.
- If smoking is essential, apply to Drugs and Alcohol Services SA for exemption to smoke or use e-cigarettes in a performance.
- · Apply at least 6 weeks prior to performance.

Although smoking is permitted in some states and territories, for <u>health and safety</u> purposes it is recommended that a smoking apparatus or prop be used instead.

## Overview of smoking in live performances in Australia:

NSW	<b>PERMITTED</b> : Smoking is permitted if it is a <u>necessary</u> part of the performance.
	Applicable legislation: <u>Smoke-free Environment Act 2000</u>
	<ul> <li>Smoking and the use of e-cigarettes (including non-nicotine) is prohibited in all enclosed public places and other smoke-free areas.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>A list of smoke-free areas can be found at: <u>Smoke-free laws - Tobacco and smoking</u> (nsw.gov.au)</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>However, <u>Section 7(2)</u> of the Act provides an exemption that allows a performer to smoke in a theatre or other performance space if smoking is deemed 'a necessary part of the performance'. This encompasses the use of e-cigarettes.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>A theatre can create a policy to ban smoking or e-cigarette use on their stage irrespective of this exemption.</li> </ul>

VIC	<u>PERMITTED</u> : Smoking herbal cigarettes (that do not contain any tobacco or nicotine) <u>NOT PERMITTED</u> : Smoking tobacco, or any e-cigarette (whether it contains nicotine or not)
	Applicable legislation: <u>Tobacco Act 1987</u>
	<ul> <li>Smoking (tobacco products) and the use of e-cigarettes (including non-nicotine) is prohibited in all indoor public places and other smoke-free areas. There are no exemptions for performances, however <u>herbal cigarettes are permitted</u>.</li> </ul>

SA	<u>PERMITTED</u> : Smoking is permitted if the Minister of Health and Wellbeing (SA) grants an exception
	<ul> <li>Applicable legislation: <i>Tobacco and E-Cigarette Products Act 1997</i></li> <li>Smoking and the use of e-cigarettes (including non-nicotine) is prohibited in all enclosed public places and other smoke-free areas.</li> <li>The full list of smoke-free areas can be found at: <u>Smoking, the rules and regulations   SA Health</u></li> <li>Smoking (including e-cigarettes and herbal cigarettes) during an artistic performance in an enclosed space is prohibited unless an exemption is granted by the Minister for Health and Wellbeing.</li> <li>Exemptions are only granted where smoking is deemed absolutely necessary to the performance and all other options have been exhausted.</li> <li>Applications for an exemption must be submitted to Drug and Alcohol Services South Australia at least 6 weeks prior to the performance.</li> <li>E: HealthDASSATobaccoControlUnit@sa.gov.au</li> </ul>

WA	<b><u>PERMITTED</u></b> : Smoking is permitted if the owner/manager of the space/venue consents.
	<ul> <li>Applicable legislation: <u>Tobacco Products Control Act 2006</u> and <u>Tobacco Products</u> <u>Control Regulations 2006</u></li> <li>The Act regulates the use of tobacco products. This includes a cigarette or cigar including tobacco, or a smoking product that contains an herb or other plant matter - whether or not the product also contains tobacco.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>It is illegal to smoke tobacco products in all enclosed public spaces and other smoke- free areas. A list of smoke-free areas can be found at: <u>Laws on smoking</u> (health.wa.gov.au)</li> </ul>
	• However, <u>Regulation 10</u> provides an exemption that allows a performer to smoke in an enclosed public space for the purpose of a performance if occupiers gave consent before the performance commenced.
	• Currently, it is legal to use e-cigarettes in smoke-free areas if they do not contain tobacco, herbs or other plant matter.
	• However, owners/managers may choose to implement a policy applying to their premises which prohibits the use of e-cigarettes wherever smoking is prohibited.

TAS	<b><u>NOT PERMITTED</u></b> : Smoking is not permitted in any indoor public place or smoke-free area.
	• Applicable legislation: <u>Public Health Act 1997</u>
	• The following products cannot be used in enclosed public spaces and other smoke- free areas: tobacco products, e-cigarettes, personal vaporisers, herbal cigarettes and non-tobacco cigarettes.

	• There are <b>no exemptions</b> for smoking as part of a performance.

ACT	<b><u>NOT PERMITTED</u></b> : Smoking is not permitted in any indoor public place or smoke-free area.
	Applicable legislation: <u>Smoke-Free Public Places Act 2003</u>
	<ul> <li>Smoking and the use of e-cigarettes (including non-nicotine) is prohibited in all enclosed public places and other smoke-free areas.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The full list of smoke-free areas can be found at: <u>Places you can't smoke or vape</u>   <u>Health (act.gov.au)</u></li> </ul>
	• There are <b>no exemptions</b> for smoking as part of a performance. Smoking includes directly, puffing, drawing or inhaling smoke and holding or having control over any smoking product while it is ignited or vape while it is activated.

NT	<b><u>PERMITTED</u></b> : Smoking is permitted if, and only for as long as, it is a <u>necessary</u> part of the performance.
	Applicable legislation: <u>Tobacco Control Act 2002</u>
	• The legislation applies to e-cigarettes as if they were tobacco products.
	<ul> <li>Smoking and the use of e-cigarettes (including non-nicotine) is prohibited in all enclosed public areas and other smoke-free areas.</li> </ul>

	• The NT Health Mental Health, Alcohol and Other Drugs) confirmed "it is not an offence for a performer taking part in a bona fide theatrical performance to 'smoke' so long as they do not continue 'smoking' or longer than is necessary for the purposes of the performance."
